





Looking eastwards to the mainland and towards the mountains that run down the spine of the Malay peninsula. These are around 100km away and rise to around 1,000-1,200 m



#### **PENANG CRUISE TERMINAL**

A large cruise vessel is about to berth at the Penang Cruise Terminal, at the eastern extremity of the island. This one looks like a Celebrity Cruises (part of Royal Caribbean Lines) vessel, due to the white X logo on the funnel. The cruise terminal is essentially an elongated pier at which several large cruise vessels can berth at the same time. There are no large terminal facilities or buildings since Penang's cruise traffic is almost entirely passengers making day-time stopover visits to the city and island; there are few, if any, international cruises that allow passengers to join or terminate in Penang.





#### WAT PAKNAM'S GOLDEN BUDDHA

Bangkok's largest seated Buddha statue, seen to the west from our hotel upon arrival – one of our favourite views in Bangkok. The statue is 5.5km away in Wat (= monastery) Paknam, but with a height of 69m (225 ft) it is very prominent. It can be seen from many parts of the city, especially from the elevated tracks of the Skytrain (urban railway). Wat Paknam, whose red roofs can be seen just to the right of the statue, is very old as a monastery, dating back to 1610, but the Buddha statue is very new – completed only in 2021.





































#### THE DUSIT THANI SPIRE RE-ERECTED

From 1970 to 2020 the Dusit Thani Hotel stood on this site at one of the city's key intersections – one of the city's first great luxury hotels. Its Japanese design included an iconic gold spire on top that took its height to 100m (330 ft), making it the city's tallest building when it opened. The spire and the hotel below it were visible from many parts of the city. A new Dusit Thani hotel and commercial centre and residences is now under construction on the site, due to start opening at end-2024. The spire of the old hotel is now being reerected on top of the new hotel structure, as a nod to the iconic old Dusit Thani that was demolished in 2019-2020.





A small (typically 10cm long overall) but brilliantly coloured bird living in the urban foliage in this part of central Bangkok. This bird is also popularly known as the Yellow-bellied Sunbird – a name that is informally used for several subspecies of sunbird, including the fairly common Olive-backed Sunbird seen in Malaysia . It is believed that "variable" in this bird's English name refers to the fact that it is found in different places with many variations in the standard colouring. The Variable Sunbird is fairly common in the highlands of eastern Africa, less so in parts of Asia further east
























#### FEATURED IN THE LONDON FINANCIAL TIMES















#### **NEW HOTEL PAUSED**

The new Steigenberger (German hotel chain) property on the riverside still remains in limbo – largely complete, but nothing happening. The Covid restrictions and the drying-up of international visitors in 2019-21 forced a delay in the intended opening. There is still no news of the opening.

#### **EAST ASIATIC COMPANY**

The iconic building of the old Danish East Asiatic Company stands forlorn and shipwrecked by the landing stages of Oriental Pier. By contrast, its neighbour to the right, the building of the old Banque de l'Indochine, has been restored and repurposed. Both these buildings date from 1900-1910 and were designed in Italianate style, popular in Bangkok at that time.



#### **OLD CUSTOMS HOUSE**

Near-neighbour to the Oriental Hotel, dating also from the 1880s and built also in the Italianate style, the old Bangkok Customs House on the riverside is undergoing restoration and conversion into a 441-room luxury hotel. The building served most recently from 1959-2019 as the Bangkok City Fire Brigade station for this district. The hotel will be managed by Langham Hospitality and will probably be named the Langham Custom House.



#### **BANGKOK CONTAINER PORT**

Early morning long shot from our room across to the container port on the Chao Phraya river as it winds its way towards the open sea. The port here is some 7 km from the camera and about 25km on the winding river from the open sea. The largest container ships serving the Bangkok area dock at the highly industrialised Laem Chabang port some 60km down the coast from the mouth of the Cho Phraya river and do not enter the river to reach the small port shown in this photo.



#### O. P. PLACE

It was built originally as a major department store to serve the European and international population of the city in the early 1900s – and seems to have been successful in that at that time.







#### THE CHINA HOUSE

This old early 1900s house, in the street leading to the Oriental Hotel, had been repurposed as an antiques store when we were first in Bangkok in the late 1970s. It was subsequently acquired by the Oriental Hotel Company, being immediately adjacent to the hotel site, and converted to a luxury Chinese restaurant. Up to that point the hotel lacked a separate Chinese restaurant with its own separate kitchen. This old house provided a good solution. However, in subsequent renovations the hotel company added a steel and glass entrance lobby and porch that is totally out of character with the rest of the building, destroying the beauty of the main facade.

#### THAI HOME INDUSTRIES BUILDING

This is an emporium selling all manner of traditional Thai craft products – metalwares, textiles, ceramics, basketware. It's been there for some 50 years and going inside is like stepping back into the past! The building is believed to have previously been a series of accommodation halls for monks – possibly associated with a monastery (or Wat) that is no longer there.

#### **POMERANIAN PROTEST**

(Through a shop window) A dog, dressed as a Christmas elf, sitting in its dog carriage inside a shop and trying to attract our passing attention. It looks like a Pomeranian or a related breed. Pomeranian dogs are very small ("toy dogs") and owe their name to their supposed region of origin, Pomerania. This was a historic region on the south coast of the Baltic Sea spanning the borders of today's Germany and Poland. Britain's Queen Charlotte (1744-1818), the consort of King George III and whose descendants included both King George V and his wife Mary of Teck, was a native of this region. Pomeranian dogs are believed to be miniaturised descendants of the old north German Spitz breed of sled dog.



#### **OLD BRITISH DISPENSARY**

View of the Silky ladies tailors shop that now occupies the ground-floor premises at the junction of Soi 40 (on the right) and Charoeng Krung (on the left). The Pomeranian dog of the previous photo was seen through a window here. In our early days in Bangkok (late 1970s, early 1980s) these premises housed a pharmacy-drug store trading under the name of The British Dispensary. We were customers there once or twice when staying at the Oriental Hotel in Soi 40. The British Dispensary in fact was founded in Bangkok by a British and an American doctor in 1892, at a time when several other pharmacies were set up to serve the growing international population in this part of the city. The BD's original location was a large house (no longer there) 150m further up Charoen Krung, at its junction with Surawong Road and the company, which still exists today, was sold to a local Thai family in 1928. At an early point the BD expanded into manufacturing (medications, supplements and personal care products) and it is still in this business today, with its well-known "snake brand" products. It no longer has any retail stores and the BD store on this site that we know from our earlier days was possibly one of the company's very last retail branches.

#### **OLD BRITISH DISPENSARY SITE**

This building that was covered on the previous page is in fact also interesting in its own right. Before hosting a store of the British Dispensary on the ground floor (now long gone) it was probably the headquarters of a significant commercial business. It extends for 5 window bays along both Charoen Krung and the adjoining Soi 40, plus the window bay at the angle. The 2 upper storeys have well-preserved Art Deco features and it is likely that it was built soon after the end of World War 2 (1939-45), if not just before then. The unusual metal-framed windows are interesting and slightly reminiscent of the Dutch artist Mondrian (1872-1944). There is a company logo (probably the building's original developer) at the top of the main façade, which appears to read FTC, TFC, CFI, CIF or similar but the company cannot be identified.

#### ANOTHER OLD SURVIVING BUILDING

Another 3 storey old building on a junction site, but the styling this time is much more the conventional Thai pseudo-colonial of the post-war years. This building stands at the angle of Charoen Krung and Silom roads and looks shipwrecked, particularly since its 3 storeys are dwarfed by the 68 storeys (rising to 247m or 810 ft) of the mixed-use State Tower immediately behind it. The same styling also extends for some distance to the right further along Charoen Krung, but with 2 storeys only. (See 2 pages back where the State Tower can be seen in the background.)

#### **SHANGRI-LA HOTEL LOBBY**


