COMMON SANDPIPER (Tringa Hypoleucos)

A winter migrant from northern Eurasia.

Looking a little bit puffed up in the unseasonally cool weather for the time of year in Bangkok.

VARIABLE SUNBIRD (CINNYRIS VENUSTUS)

A small (typically 10cm long overall) but brilliantly coloured bird living in the urban foliage in this part of central Bangkok. This bird is also popularly known as the Yellow-bellied Sunbird – a name that is informally used for several subspecies of sunbird, including the fairly common Olive-backed Sunbird seen in Malaysia . It is believed that "variable" in this bird's English name refers to the fact that it is found in different places with many variations in the standard colouring. The Variable Sunbird is fairly common in the highlands of eastern Africa, less so in parts of Asia further east

This small bird, seen just off our balcony, looks wet and puffed up as he rests during a rain shower.



A VERY SMALL BIRD, pobably COMMON TAILOR BIRD (Orthotomus Sutorius)

A fleeting glimpse of another very small (10cm overall) bird that frequents our property. The short, but nevertheless thin and pointed beak distinguishes it from the other small bird of this size, the Olive-backed Sunbird, that has a longer and noticeably curved beak.

OLIVE-BACKED SUNBIRD (Cinnyris Jugularis)

A very small (10cm overall) but common bird feeding on flower nectar and sometimes small insects. There are a number of subvarieties covered by the general grouping of "olive-backed sunbird". The absence of a frontal view makes it difficult to be more precise in this photo. The distinctive sunbird beak (thin, pointed, curved) is clearly visible here. The dark blue or black "bib", indicating a male, is also just visible here


